

Climate Youth Ambassadors



PLACE AND DATE: 4-7 July 2018, Höör, Sweden.

PARTICIPANTS: 20 young people (2 participants from each countries)

COUNTRIES: Sweden, Denmark, Lithuania, Turkey, Jordan, Russia, Belarus, Ukraine, Romania and Morocco).

LANGUAGE: The working language is English.



SUMMARY OF PROJECT



According to both, the UN and the EU, climate change is the biggest collective, environmental challenge society faces today. Notwithstanding, youth and particularly youth from rural areas often do not have the relevant skills and opportunities to make their voice heard and advocate for a greener future. Therefore, our project aims at empowering youth, mainly from rural areas in Sweden, Denmark, Lithuania, Turkey, Jordan, Russia, Belarus, Ukraine, Romania and Morrocco to formulate and communicate their concerns about climate change with decision-makers, and advocate for their right to a healthy, sustainable and safe environment on an international, national and local level. Throughout the project, climate change is seen a challenge that has to be tackled by the international community and therefore serves as a platform for international exchange and collaboration.

The project activities comprise the 4 days training A Training for Youth Workers. The training will provide 20 young youth workers (under 30 years old) from Sweden, Denmark, Lithuania, Turkey, Jordan, Russia, Belarus, Ukraine, Romania and Morrocco with practical knowledge and innovative methods to empower young people to become climate youth ambassadors who are capable of advocating their environmental concerns towards decision-makers.

PARTICIPANTS

Background and selection of participants for (A 1);

Partners will select two (2) youth trainers to participate in the training "Empowering Youth Climate Ambassadors: A training for Youth Workers" in Sweden. In order to fulfill the



selection criteria, the chosen youth workers must: 1) have education background in social work / social science and/or or environmental studies 2) have 1-2 years of work experience with young people 3) have a good command of English 4) be under 30 years old.

Age and Gender Balance of Participants (A1);

The youth workers participating in the training will be 18-30 years old in order to specifically address young youth workers. At least 50% of the participants will be young women in order to strengthen their competences and therefore role in the societies involved in the project. Each organization is responsible for ensuring that at least 2 of the youth workers are women.



PROJECT TEAM

Project planning and facilitation will be maintained by trainers from Sweden and Turkey, with help from group leaders from all partner organisations from respective countries.

TRAVEL COSTS

According to new Erasmus Plus rules, the reimbursement of travel costs will be calculated used a specific program called Distance Calculator:

After sending their tickets and boarding cards, participants will receive the reimbursement of their travel costs. Travel (flights, other means of transport) expenses are compensated (up to 100%), based on the actual expenses incurred and the distance from your location of residence to the location of the project (Höör, Sweden). We don't send money to each participant, only to sender organization and sender organization will pay to participants their costs back.

Visa costs will be covered by participants.

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THE VENUE



Höör (Swedish pronunciation: <u>[hœ:r]</u>) is a <u>locality</u> and the seat of <u>Höör Municipality</u>, <u>Skåne</u> <u>County</u>, <u>Sweden</u> with 7,865 inhabitants in 2010.^[1]

The town's original spelling was *Hör*. The present, unusual spelling with double "<u>ö</u>" was implemented by the <u>Swedish postal service</u> at the beginning of the 20th century. At that time, it was a common practice in Sweden to write *Här* (for *here*) on the address column of local letters. In order to avoid confusion between letters to be delivered locally and those intended for Hör, the postal service has therefore changed the town's name to Höör.

Note: Organisers will not provide any accommodation for additional stay in Höör. If participants plan to arrive a few days earlier or depart a few days later they are kindly requested to inform us and we will be glad to offer assistance with booking a hotel.

- ✓ Prepare a short easy-going presentation on diversity in your country, find interesting videos / games / exercises / educational activities on diversity.
- \checkmark Prepare **exercises/energizers** that could be done in the morning by all the participants.
- ✓ Prepare for your country's cultural evening. Please, try to be fun and creative for this! Any kind of activities are welcome (e.g. video presentations, dances, songs, games, quizzes, posters, flyers etc.). We count on you to make these evenings as interactive and fun as possible.
- ✓ check the weather forecast before arrival and bring adequate clothes. Please also bring clothing and shoes that can be used for strenuous activities (such as dancing and outdoor activities in the forest).
- ✓ Bring good spirit, joy and happiness!!!
